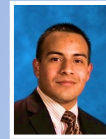

What is Celebration of Learning Night?

During this event, students will be showcasing how they have grown as scholars and disciples. They will be putting on professional level presentations in their classrooms through which they will be sharing their major projects and expeditions from throughout the year. Seeds of Hope

Remember to go online and complete the application process for your financial funding for 2018-2019 school year. If you have any problems or need assistance with the process, please do not hesitate to contact the school office. We do have the paper applications in the office if you prefer to have us upload the Seeds of Hope as we always have in the past. Please request an application from the school office if you want one. You will have to bring in your 2017 tax forms as before for us to copy and get all of it off the Seeds of Hope. ALL and ANY Seeds of Hope funds will ONLY be distributed if you qualify through the on line system and the completion of ALL fields and documents. Mr. Moo will use the formula to give tuition assistance for 2018-2019 school year. The deadline for tuition assistance applications is April 18, 2018

After you have completed the process and we have received confirmation of application and funds awarded we can make the appointment to register for 2018-2019 school year. Families will receive a call or you may call to see where your application is in the process to make a registration appointment.
