## SLC's 2<sup>nd</sup> Trimester

## **Student Led Conferences (SLC'S)**

We have SLC's scheduled on February 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Trimester. Each student and their parents are to attend. This is counted as a school day. This gives your children a chance to share their studies and goals with you on a very personal and inviting level. The SLC's are anywhere from 15 minutes to 1/2 an hour depending on the time frame your child needs to share this special time with you.

During the 2 days of SLC's (February 6<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup>) there will NOT be regular school classes. Teachers, students, and parents meet in the classrooms for 15 minutes each. Attendance is taken during SLC's and recorded on the student's permanent record.

We are sending home a signup sheet for each family to request the day and time that best fits your family day/evening. When these sheets are returned to the teacher Esther schedules the SLC's by family so each family/siblings have a back to back SLC with their children and can complete the conferences within the same hour and day. Scheduling is done on a first come first serve basis as forms are returned to the office.

- C) The Archdiocese of Denver Accounting Office, working with information from the Office of Catholic Schools, file the Annual Certification of Racial Nondiscrimination forms with the IRS.
- D) All paperwork associated with the publication of the statements are to be government and Archdiocesan personnel when/if requested.
