#### <u>Parent, Teacher, Student Conferences will be</u> October 8<sup>th</sup> & 9<sup>th</sup>

You and your child(ren) are required to attend Parent, Teacher, Student Conferences. All of our scholarships require families to attend school functions and we are required to inform them of the family attendance. Conferences are scheduled in your child's records as a full day of school and attendance is taken for their attendance record although these days will not be a regular school day. You will be given an opportunity to choose a 20 minute time slot via "SignUp Genius" that best fits your family and work schedule. On October 8<sup>th</sup> from 10:00 to 6:30 or October 9<sup>th</sup> from 7:30 to 2:30.

If you have an issue that arises when it is your day and time that you chose, please call the school and we can see if there is a different available time slot that you are able to attend.



#### Individual school pictures

We will have individual pictures on Wednesday, October 15<sup>th</sup>. We realize that you use your children's school pictures for Christmas cards so your children will be allowed to be out of uniform for their pictures. PLEASE make sure to follow the out of uniform policies: No spaghetti straps, no shorts with the exception of uniform shorts, only shirts that are appropriate for school.

Retakes for absent children will take place on Thursday, November 13<sup>th</sup> in the AM ONLY. Fliers will be sent home as soon as we receive them so you can purchase picture packets online. You can also send payments with your children in the order form on picture day to give to the photographer. We do NOT carry cash to make change, SORRY!
